Created with the support of The Duke of Westminster, the Duke of Westminster's Medal for Military Literature has been awarded annually since 1997. The award is given to a book by a living author, regardless of nationality, gender or age, who makes a notable and original contribution to the study of international and national security and defence.

Rules of Entry

- Closing date for entries is **19/12/2011**
- Entries are open to a book by a living author, published between 1 May 2011 and 31 May 2012, that makes a significant contribution to international defence and security studies or military history.
- To enter, submit two copies of the book or book proof, along with the completed entry form to the address below. (Please also ensure you email a copy of the completed application form so that we can acknowledge receipt of your entry.)

- Judging is by a finalised shortlist and judging panel. The judges' decision is final.
